**Survey Comments**

Comment re: Question #2 – Partners noted that planning collaboratively is one of the CRVSHP’s strengths. Moving forward the region would urge the province the budget number as early as possible as this would help support effective collaborative planning.

Comment re: Question #3 - Partners agreed that there are many examples of collaborative decision making in the region and noted that the flexibility of the CRVSHP model enables this. Additionally partners agreed that they would like to highlight to the province that the region’s collaboration is both strategic and proactive.

Comment re: Question #4 - As the CRVSHP clearly separates SHP services from baseline services the word “coordinated” would be more descriptive of our process than “integrated”. Also the complexity of having 100+ independent schools in the CRVSHP makes it difficult to give a global answer to this question. Some of the independent schools coordinate the SHP services with their baseline services more successfully than others.

Additional Comment for the end of the Annual Report:

Anticipating the implementation of *Setting the Direction* and the corresponding uncertain future of Student Health the Calgary Rocky View Steering Committee would like to emphasize that SHP is working extremely well in this region. Calgary Rocky View wants to build on the collaborative success they’ve already had and to reassure our stakeholders that they will not be abandoned after the time that’s been invested to understand and trust SHP. The region is open to considering new models; they just want the province to consider the successes of SHP in their decision making. Finally although there is still considerable unmet need in the region, the Student Health Partnership has been critical in helping the students and families in our region for the past 11 years. It is difficult to imagine the situation our students and families would be in without Student Health.
